## BFA Application for Admission: Internal Transfer Corcoran School of the Arts and Design The George Washington University

Transfer students are accepted as Corcoran School majors through a selective application process that commences only after the student is admitted to the University. If Columbian College of Arts and Sciences (CCAS) is not already their home school, students who are accepted into a Corcoran BFA program of study will be required to internally transfer to CCAS. Applications are not accepted from students with more than 75 credit hours earned. A student may apply no more than twice to the major. Expectations for admission include a GPA of 3.0 and submission of a digital portfolio (with accompanying image list) containing 10 images of recent art works -- photographs, examples of design, fine art projects, and/ or multi-media. Applicants may also submit up to 10 minutes of time-based work (such as video or performance documenation).

Option #1: Send 10 jpgs of work samples as email attachment to Dr. Lisa Lipinski. See email address below. Each jpg must be under 1MB.

Option #2: Hand deliver a thumb drive to the Director's Office. Thumb drive must be in a sealed envelope, marked with your name, email address, and GWID.

Information to include in your image list: File Name; Title of Work; Size or Duration; Medium or Materials; 1-3 sentence project desciption. Include your image list as a PDF or Word document.
