Gelman Library

Gelman is located at the corner of 22nd and H Streets, with the entrance through Kogan Plaza. 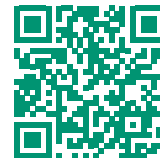
GW Writing Center

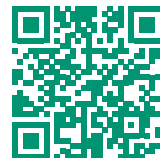

THE CORCORAN

Our history dates back to 1869, when William Wilson Corcoran founded the Corcoran Gallery of Art with works from his own collection and formed one of the first major publicly accessible art collections in the nation's capital. The gallery was originally housed in a building, now known as the Renwick, on the corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 17th Street NW. It was a draw for D.C. residents, visitors and aspiring artists. By the 1870s, semi-formal lessons were being offered by artists in the gallery.

In 1897, the Corcoran Gallery moved into the historic Flagg Building, where many of our classes are taught today. One year later, in 1898, Corcoran founded an official art school associated with the gallery. Since integrating into the George Washington University in 2014, the Corcoran School has undergone a multi-dimensional transformation while still maintaining our founder's vision of a place "dedicated to the art and used solely for the purpose of encouraging the *American Genius*."

The Corcoran School of the Arts & Design prepares its graduates to be the next generation of global leaders. As part of the Columbian College of Arts and Sciences, the school functions as an incubator for artists, designers, performers and scholars who learn from internationally renowned faculty at the intersection of creativity and social innovation. We are a community of civically engaged artists and practitioners aiming to impact the world through social change. Instead of teaching art in a singular way, we pride ourselves on the diversity of our practice and view ourselves as a place of possibility for students. Our students are poised not just to join the creative field of their choice, but also to define it for themselves as they become well versed in practice, research and collaboration.

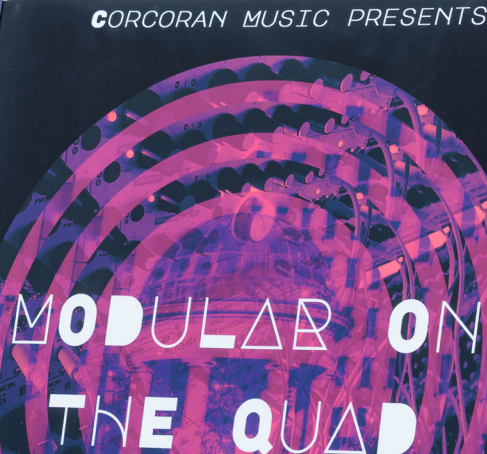

GroW Garden

The GroW Community Garden is a block-length plot of land (located on H Street between 23rd and 24th Streets). It is supported by the George Washington University and maintained by two student managers (employed by the university) as well as a strong volunteer base. All of the produce is grown to support the work of Miriam's Kitchen, a nonprofit organization that aims to end chronic homelessness in Washington, D.C. Miriam's incorporates fresh, local produce into the meals they serve to their guests Monday through Friday, every week of the year. GroW produce goes right into the kitchens of folks who are housed through Miriam's Permanent Supportive Housing program, which transitions around 135 individuals experiencing homelessness into housing while continuing to provide supportive services.

The GroW Community offers students and community members a space to engage with sustainable agricultural practices, consider issues of food access and food sovereignty in Washington, D.C., and cultivate community around food.

The GroW Community also facilitates a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program that connects students with local farmers and producers to purchase CSA farm shares of fresh, local produce and other food items using GWorld.

Campus SafeRide and GW Rider App

SafeRide provides a free and safe ride to and from Foggy Bottom Campus residence halls and academic buildings during late night hours for students, faculty and staff who prefer to not walk alone. This SafeRide service operates seven days a week during the academic year (except on designated university holidays) from 8 p.m. until 4 a.m.

Access this service in three ways:

1. Download the GW Rider App, which is available in the Apple or Google Play stores. Log into the app using GW's Single Sign-On (SSO) and request a ride similar to how you request an Uber or Lyft.
2. Log in to the [website](#) using GW's SSO and request a ride.
3. Call 202-994-RIDE (7433) between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m.

U•Pass® Student Transit Program for Metro & Metrobus

Undergraduate students enrolled in on-campus classes (e.g.: not study abroad or traditional online only programs) within the Columbian College of Arts & Sciences, Elliott School of International Affairs, GW's Business School, Milken Institute School of Public Health and School of Engineering & Applied Science are included in this mandatory **U•Pass** public transit program. Eligible undergraduate students will automatically be assessed the subsidized mandatory student fee on their eBill each fall and spring that they are enrolled.

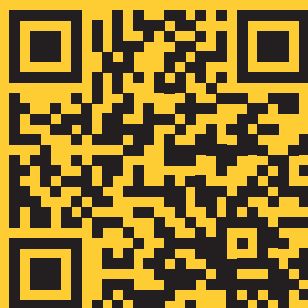
