The Naomi Rabb Winston Scholarship in Two-Dimensional Art is an annual scholarship in honor of the late Naomi Rabb Winston who endowed the Winston Scholarships, is available through the National Society of Arts and Letters to visual artists ages 16 to 22 years.

Frank Wright (1932-2020), was a local artist and professor, at George Washington University. He was born in NE Washington DC, attended Eastern High School and was able to study art at American University with an award from NSAL! A member of NSAL-DC's Advisory Council and past Judge of Winston Art, his family, friends and members of NSAL-DC have generously given towards the Frank Wright Award. Also divided into the two age categories

- Applicants must demonstrate exceptional talent and promise of future success.
- The scholarship funds are for private study, special training or personal advancement in the applicants' chosen art fields. The funds can be used for college tuition and required art supplies, but not for housing, travel or personal expenses.
- Scholarship funds are sent to the institution, teacher or program selected by the scholarship recipient. Scholarship recipients have 15 months to use the funds.
- Scholarship recipients may reapply as often as their age allows and are eligible to participate in other NSAL competitions.

ELIGIBILITY Applicants must:

- 1. Be a citizen of the United States. A copy of birth certificate, passport, or naturalization papers must be submitted with application.
- 2. Be at least 16 years old, but not older than 22 years by March 1, 2022.

ARTISTIC REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The art works must be original and created by traditional methods. <u>Photographs, computer generated imager or computer digital</u> painting and three-dimensional works are "not" permitted.
- 2. The style of work may be realistic, abstract or expressive.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS TO THE WASHINGTON DC CHAPTER (incl. Md & Northern Va)

- 1. The following should be posted to a Google Drive Folder and a shareable link and should be sent by Tuesday, February 1st, 2022, by 5 pm to nsalcelia.josephs@gmail.com:
 - a) a completed 2 page Application Form,
 - b) a copy of the applicant's US birth certificate or current US passport/naturalization certificate
 - c) images of 5 examples of the applicant's artwork (high resolution jpeg) Each image must be labeled with the artist's name, title and the medium of the artwork.

Note the application must show the title, the dimensions of the work and the date it was completed. Art works must have been done within the past two years

2. Works must be two-dimensional and may be on paper, canvas, masonite, metal or wood panels. Mediums may include pencil, pen, charcoal, colored pencil, watercolor, gouache, tempera, oil, encaustic, acrylic, mixed media and original prints created by the printmaking processes.

ADJUDICATION

- 1. Qualified judges will be given copies of the age and brief bio of each artist and how they want to use their scholarships.
- 2. NSAL-DC judges will select the artwork of two applicants as winners, one in each age category, (whose applications will besent to National NSAL) and up to five Highly Commended applicants. Note: The two WA-DC winners will have to mail in their application form with a flash drive (see Technical Requirements above para) by Mon, Feb 21, 2022 to Celia Josephs, NSAL-DC Chair, who will mail in their complete applications to the National Chair before the March 1st, 2022 National WA deadline.

PROTECTION

- 1. Care and caution must be exercised in the handling of all flash drives. (Winners only to provide flash drives when informed).
- 2. NSAL-DC reserves the right to reproduce in color or in black and white, the flash drives of the art submitted by the finalists. The reproduction will be used for educational and/or publicity purposes only.

DEADLINES

- 1. Contestant applications are due to the NSAL Chapter nearest their homes, schools, universities or colleges <u>by February 1, 2022.</u> For Chapter addresses, see Chapter contacts.
- 2. Chapters must send the application(s) of their finalist(s) to the National Chair before the March 1, 2022 deadline.
- 3. Winston Art Scholarship recipients will be announced the first week in April 2022.
